OFNTSC Environment Team Update

First Nations, Tribal Council Solid Waste Coordinators and members of the OFNTSC's Environment team attended the SWANA facilitated training - Landfill Operations Basics and best practices for prevention and extinguishing landfill fires

The training, held in Thunder Bay from January 21-23, 2020, highlighted the important role and functions of regulated sanitary landfills in the overall integrated solid waste management system.

The training specifically covered spotting and waste screening, equipment maintenance, cell construction and compaction, litter control, landfill safety, landfill gas generation, leachate production, and groundwater management. The training was supported with a tour to the Thunder Bay Landfill Waste Management site.



The Environmental Team also organized a Webinar on Energy Efficiency and

Mold Management on **January 23, 10:30-11:30**. The online event was planned for *Independent Electricity System Operator's (IESO)* - Community Energy Champions. The presentation covered energy efficiency strategies to control, remediate, and mitigate mold in the built environment.
