With the help of OFNTSC, Pikwakanagan has received confirmation for funding of \$2 million for the design of their water treatment plant!

We are happy to share that Algonquins of Pikwakanagan has been approved funding for the detailed design for a new, communal water treatment plant.

This First Nation is currently serviced by individual systems, and concern with groundwater quality has necessitated this project.

This is a big milestone, as Merv Sarazin of Pikwakanagan and the community have been working tirelessly for years with OFNTSC providing support to reach this stage. Rob Olivier, our engineer who sadly passed away in February, was a key team member in this project and we will be continuing his hard work to make this project a success.

Funding Opportunity! Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program (ICIP) - Green Stream

This intake will provide up to \$200 million in combined federal and provincial funding and will focus on projects that rehabilitate or replace water, wastewater or stormwater infrastructure assets to improve critical health and safety issues in small communities.

To target funding where it is needed the most, Municipalities and First Nations communities with populations under 100,000 along with Local Services Boards, Conservation Authorities and other not-for-profit entities who own eligible infrastructure assets are eligible to apply for project funding up to a maximum of \$3 million in total eligible costs.
