
Building IESO's Community Capacity Through Energy Champions September 4-6, 2019, Rama First Nation.

OFNTSC organized the second workshop for the southern First Nation communities. IESO's Community Energy Champions (CEC) from Whitefish River FN, Chippewas of Georgina Island, Aamjiwnaang First Nation, Atikamesheng Anishnawbek First Nation, Sagamok Anishnawbek First Nation, Ogemawahj Tribal Council, Chippewas of Rama First Nation, Ontario Aboriginal Housing Services, Bingwi Neyaashi Anishnaabek First Nation, Wahgoshig FN, Pic Mobert First Nation, and Temagami First Nation attended the hands-on workshop.

The workshop included two days of in-class sessions on the community energy plan, baselines and data assessment, basic units and applications, built environment, energy efficiency measures and conservation in home, community, and at work places. A field visit included performing energy audit in a residence and the community center.









The Ministry of Infrastructure is accepting applications for Community, Culture and Recreation Projects up to \$50 million for a new project or \$5 million for renovation/rehabilitation projects. Applications must be submitted to Ministry by November 12, 2019. It is a one-time submission opportunity.

Eligible projects are recreation facilities (example hockey rinks, recreation centres, playing fields, etc); cultural facilities (cultural centres, theatres, museums, etc); community centres / hubs; and education and health facilities which advance the Truth and Reconciliation Calls to Action. You can submit more than one application.
